WHAT YOU WILL FIND AT BOOTHMAN HOUSE...

BOOTHMAN HOUSE, which was built in 1981, consists of 30 self-contained flats. Each flat has a bedroom, lounge, fitted kitchen and bathroom. Each kitchen is provided with an electric cooker and refrigerator. All the flats are centrally heated and have a constant supply of hot water. Flats 1-16 are situated on the ground floor, whilst flats 17-30 are located on the first floor and a lift is provided to access this area. Each of the ground floor flats has a shower cubicle (with a seat), whilst the first floor flats each have a bath.

Boothman House is situated near Streatfield Road, and is within 10 minutes walking distance of local shops, which include a Post Office and other amenities. Public transport offers a frequent service to and from Harrow and Edgware.

Boothman House is an attractive scheme, with a communal lounge, which is used for many social events. There is a laundry room with washers and dryers for use by tenants; a guestroom is available for visiting relatives or friends who wish to stay overnight, for which a small charge is made.

There is also a well stocked library and a communal garden for tenants to enjoy.

FOR YOUR PEACE OF MIND...

Each flat at Boothman House is equipped with an alarm cord 24-hour emergency call system. The main entry door to the building has been fitted with an electronic mechanism to maximise security and CCTV has recently been installed. Each flat has its own lockable front door, although the Warden has a master key for use in an emergency. The warden lives at the scheme and attends to the daily management of the building and responds to tenants needs. At weekends or when the Warden is off duty, a mobile Warden provides the service.

YOUR SOCIAL LIFE...

Tenants who enjoy company can take part in the social events organised at the scheme such as Bingo, coffee mornings, social evenings and organised trips.

Tenants are encouraged to organise their own events with help form the warden. A notice board, usually located in the foyer, will display other activities within the scheme and community events that may be taking place that tenants might enjoy.
