## What is Sheltered Housing?

Sheltered Housing is designed for older people and offers accompodation with sheltered scheme staff to provide help and support to allow tenants to maintain their independence.

#### The benefits of living in a sheltered scheme include:

- 24 hour emergency alarm system in each property
- Independent living within a secure building
- Security and peace of mind
- Laundry facilities and other services
- A "home for life" wherever possible, with care and support tailored to meet individual and changing needs
- Good quality housing where repairs are taken care of
- Communal facilities for social activities.



### Who is eligible?

Anyone over 55 years, single or married couples are most welcome.

#### How to apply

If you are interested in applying for accommodation, please telephone our Head Office on 0121 377 8899 for an application form. When the form is completed and returned, an interview will be arranged.

Your application will be assessed and you will be placed on the waiting list if you are eligible.

If you are in council accommodation you will need to speak to your Neighbourhood Office first and ask how you should proceed. If you are unsure about sheltered housing and wish to visit a scheme before you apply, this can be arranged.

#### Role of the **Sheltered Scheme** Officer

- ◆ To welcome you into your new home
- ◆ To provide information about local facilities and provide support
- ◆ To keep in touch with you each week day
- ◆ To liaise with your doctor, family or Social Services on your behalf if vou wish

◆ To manage the Health & Safety of the building. the administration and maintenance of the building and gardens.

#### What the Officer cannot do

- Staff do not provide any nursing care
- ◆ Staff are not responsible for storing or administering drugs or medicines for tenants
- ♦ In an emergency during normal working hours, you can call the Officer for help by using the alarm system in your property (orange pull cords). When the Officer is off duty your call will go through to the 24hour emergency service. You can speak to the control centre and explain your problem or summon help.
